It is hard to imagine that only 12 years ago people would not have entered this village because of its association with leprosy. It is a great testament to the work that a day such as this was possible! Well done to all!

The Magic of the Endorphin Release Therapy

Greetings from the Endorphin Release Therapy team of Ahoto.

Endorphin Release Therapy is part of the daily routine at Ahotokurom and Auntie Bea, Charles and Ben also treat many patients in their own homes.

Endorphin Release Therapy has proved to be one of the best interventions in the Holistic Care provided. It is very simple and yet proves itself time and time again to bring healing to those for whom traditional medicine has been unable to help. This is seen very specially in the mentally /physically challenged children. Wounds heal much faster, people with asthma get instant relief and people talk of a feeling of well-being. With our mentally/ physically challenged children, although they cannot tell us how they are feeling, they are seen to sleep better and spastic limbs relax. Their appetite and ability to chew their food improves. Also their ability to respond to human contact. such as a smile or a gurgle... This gives anxious parents great hope and also the fact that their child can come each day for a few hours gives them a little respite and helps them to feel they are not alone in their responsibility for their disabled child.

The team at Ahotokurom does not charge for the service, but often those who have been helped do think to give a donation to the elderly people or the children. People with chronic pain are usually referred by expatients who have already experienced great relief from Endorphin Release Therapy. That is surely the best testimony!

Fr Philip celebrates three years of priesthood......

Those of you who remember Fr Philip's story will be delighted to see he is now celebrating his third year in the priesthood. Following a severe car accident

he was paralysed from the neck down and it was feared he would die from his injuries. With the support of Ahotokurom he was nursed back to life and although he remains paralysed he was ordained a Priest in 2008

In Father Philips words:-

"I will always give thanks to God and bless His holy name because of His goodness to me. Indeed the Lord has done a lot in my life and it is by God's grace, your prayers and your support that I am what I am today. In order to show my appreciation to God for how far He has brought me, I have dedicated my third anniversary in the holy priesthood, which I see as a miracle, to the service of God. In view of this I have decided to repair the ceiling of a church building in one of the outstations in St Anthony's Catholic Church, Atonkwa. The whole project will cost about 5,000 Euros. The local people have contributed 25% of the total amount. I cannot achieve this all alone without your support, and no amount is too small. Therefore I would like to appeal to you to assist me to pursue this worthy cause, and God will bless you in abundance. Again and again, let me take this opportunity to thank all the people especially the "Friends of Ahotokurom" for all your help and support in bringing me so far. May the Good Lord bless you all."
